THE CLATTERBRIDGE CANCER CENTRE

The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre NHS Foundation Trust is one of the UK's leading cancer centres providing highly specialist cancer care to a population of 2.4m people across Cheshire, Merseyside and the surrounding areas, including the Isle of Man.

The Trust employs 1,800 staff and its three specialist cancer centres can be found in Liverpool city centre, Wirral and Aintree. It also operates specialist chemotherapy clinics in district hospitals across Cheshire and Merseyside and delivers a pioneering Treatment at Home service. All of which combine to treat over 33,000 patients each year with the great care for which Clatterbridge is best known and loved.

Together, this unique network of care enables Clatterbridge to provide a comprehensive range of inpatient care, advanced radiotherapy, chemotherapy and other systemic anti-cancer therapies, like gene therapies and immunotherapies.

It is also the only facility in the UK providing low-energy proton beam therapy to treat rare eye cancers. Additionally, it hosts the region's Teenage and Young Adult Unit.

Much of this work has been made possible thanks to Charity donations and would not be possible through NHS funding alone.

FUNDING LIFE SAVING RESEARCH

shaping cancer care for generations to come.



Your support enables clinicians to look at new ways to treat and prevent cancer, supports clinical trials and helps to give patients at The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre access to the latest breakthrough cancer therapies.

Over the next five years, investment from the Charity will be directed to the Trust's research agenda and will pump prime projects to enhance the incredible work done by researchers at the Centre.

Training doctors in clinical research

The Charity is offering the brightest doctors at Clatterbridge the chance to develop as future research leaders by funding their scientific training, under the supervision of expert scientists at Clatterbridge.

One such person is Dr Jim Parry who has been a doctor at Clatterbridge for five years and has recently undertaken his first steps into the world of lab-based cancer research.



"The science of immunotherapy is very young, there is still so much to be understood. The only way to do that is to ask new questions and explore new boundaries."

"I will be analysing the immune cells of patients at a level of detail which has never been done, to help us to design better therapies in the future.

Research Development Fund

Cancer survival has doubled in the last 40 years thanks to a worldwide investment in research.

As a Charity supporting a region where cancer incidence is high and survival rates are sometimes poor – we want to help The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre to bring the latest treatments and trials to its patients.

The Research and Innovation Directorate at Clatterbridge has shown rapid expansion in clinical trials in recent years, and it's thanks to your donations that we can support research at Clatterbridge in so many ways:

- Informing clinical decisions around cancer treatment in relation to the effects of Covid-19 on people with cancer.
- Recruitment of additional clinical trials nursing staff to enable more patients to take part.

Innovations in Care Fund

We have created a way for staff and volunteers at The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre to make a real, positive change to the people they meet every day on the front line.

Through the Bright Ideas programme, projects funded can range from huge, life-changing innovations, to smaller touches that change what we do, while have a big impact; caring for people in a way that goes beyond NHS services to provide the best possible treatment.

It's thanks to Charity donations that we can make these Bright Ideas a reality. Just a few examples include:

Chemotherapy in the Community supporting the Trust's continued aim to bring cancer care closer to the people who need it, by providing treatment at home and work.

Scalp Coolers which can limit the damage to hair follicles for some patients, helping them to keep their hair. Supporting their self-esteem and helping them to feel more in control of their treatments.

Massage guns to relieve pain and muscular aches, reducing the need for prescribed drugs.

360 degree toothbrushes are a small, but gentle and effective way for very sick patients to manage their mouth care.

Support for children and families Imagine being a child and learning that a loved one has cancer.

Through the work of the Family Support Practitioner at Clatterbridge, the Charity helps to carry these families through one of the toughest times of their lives with love, giving children the tools to cope with the diagnosis and possible death of a parent or loved one.

This includes counselling, preparing memory boxes, play therapy resources, books and journals.

The CANtreat chemotherapy clinic in Halton is run by specialist staff from The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre. With your support, we can improve the environment and provide new equipment at the clinic to give patients the best experience.

Arts In Health

Funded by donations, the Charity offers a range of artwork, creative activities and performances for patients and staff at The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre.

Through our Arts Co-ordinator, we enhance the patient environment to **create welcoming and calm spaces.**

We arrange **arts activities and workshops** which relieve boredom, improve mood and reduce anxiety for patients.

Our **music programme** entertains and engages our patients and their families with live performances and person-centres music making activities.

Evidence shows that music and art can support cancer patients, increase relaxation and reduce fatigue, improving the relationship with one's body and promote hope.

INVESTING IN LEADING TECHNOLOGY

Supporting clinical colleagues to develop the latest advances in cancer treatment and technology which can transform how people with cancer are cared for; while helping to fund the digital environment that makes such a difference to patients.



The Biobank at Clatterbridge has been supported by charity donations and is an important resource in answering some of cancer's biggest questions:

CCC Biobank

Why do some cells turn into cancer? How can we detect cancer earlier? Why do people respond to treatment differently?

A biobank is a repository of biological material, for example; plasma, serum, saliva and cellular matieral. They are collected from patients with difference types of cancer at different stages and enable scientists at Clatterbridge to find out more about the disease.

Virtual Reality in cancer care

A successful trial at The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre has found that using virtual reality (VR) technology can significantly decrease stress levels and reduce discomfort during procedures and time in hospital.

Patients can wear the VR headset and interact with fun and relaxing scenes using a handheld device such as images of nature or mindfulness methods which can reduce any anxiety they experience when undergoing treatment.

With your support, we hope to purchase more headsets to support patients across the Trust's network of care.
